You are receiving this letter and the attached Notice because you have a burial agreement with a Wisconsin Funeral Directors Association member funeral home. People with burial agreements are referred to under Wisconsin law as "Depositors," and that is how I address you here. The money you paid for your burial agreement was placed in the Wisconsin Funeral Trust.


In September of 2012, the Dane County Circuit Court appointed me as Receiver for the Wisconsin Funeral Trust. The Trust had a deficit, and the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions claimed that it was not properly managed. I was appointed Receiver to manage the remaining funds and to investigate and try to recover funds that were lost from responsible parties. Since then, the team I assembled and I have been working to make sure you receive the benefits you were promised.

The attached Notice describes a settlement I negotiated with funeral homes. The settlement affects your rights and is an important step in ensuring that you receive what you were promised.

I am pleased to inform you that, if your funeral home signs the settlement agreement and the settlement is approved by the Court, you are guaranteed to receive the funeral, burial merchandise and services you were promised, regardless of the money available in the Trust. You also will, under certain circumstances, be allowed to transfer your burial contract to another funeral home or withdraw part of your funds in the Trust. If the settlement is signed and approved, there are no circumstances under which you can receive less than the amount you initially paid for the burial agreement.
